### **Corn/Soybean Schools Coming in January**

The annual collaboration between Kansas Corn, Kansas Soybean, and K-State Research & Extension for Corn and Soybean educational events across the area are this year combined into a single day, with this year's event coming to Northeast Kansas on Tuesday, January 14<sup>th</sup>.

The full day event will include four agronomic and one ag economics topic of interest to corn and soybean growers. Morning presentations will focus on diseases of concern (K-State Research & Extension Plant Pathologist Dr. Rodrigo Onofre) and fertility management (Nutrient Management Specialist Dr. Dorivar Ruiz-Diaz in the morning. Dr. Sarah Lancaster, K-State Weed Management Specialist will headline the afternoon, providing an overview of new herbicide products and regulations of potential interest to growers.

Geiger Ag (1758 Coronado Rd., Highland) will be this year's host. Doors open at 8:30 with refreshments. The program will start at 9:00. Lunch will be served onsite. CCA and Commercial Pesticide Applicator credits have been applied for. The program will conclude by 3:00 P.M.
